## REPORT ON PARLIAMENTARY ELECTIONS, 1951 to 1955

THE HONOURABLE THE CHIEF SECRETARY.

I HAVE the honour to submit the following report on elections held during the period, 1951-1955.

### THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

Appendix "A" appended hereto shows the enrolment as at the 31st December, 1954, in the respective Divisions of the Council.

Since this date, enrolment has increased considerably owing to the extension of the franchise in 1954 to provide for the spouse of the Owner or Occupier of property being qualified for enrolment as Legislative Council Electors, and the granting of the franchise to inhabitant occupiers.

For the period from the 31st December, 1954, to the 30th June, 1955, enrolment for the Legislative Council Divisions has increased from 71,430 to 79,521, an overall increase of 8091 in enrolment for the half year. This is due to increased attention being given to the enrolment of spouses and general broadening of the Franchise.

By an amendment of the Public Service Act, the State Electoral Office (formerly part of the Chief Secretary's and Premier's Department) was made a separate Department, and I was appointed as Chief Electoral Officer, with offices in Chancellor's building, Davey Street, Hobart.

The object of this appointment was to give particular attention to Elections generally and following the necessary amendments to the "Electoral Act 1907," to provide for the whole of the Legislative Council Rolls for the several Divisions in the State, being prepared in the office of the Chief Electoral Officer by experienced Electoral Registrars appointed for that purpose.

### "DEADLOCKS" IN THE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY.

By an amendment of the "Electoral Act 1907," provision was made for the constitution of an Electoral Commission comprising The Chief Electoral Officer, The Government Statistician, and The Vice Chancellor of the University of Tasmania, who were directed to consider and report upon the Polling at the Election and after the completion of the scrutiny at the General Election to certify by notice in the Gazette, the result of the Election.

The Electoral Commission reported the result of the Election as required by the Electoral Act, and a certificate was published in the Gazette of the 23rd March, 1955.

A Certificate and return specifying the total number of votes allocated to each of the political parties was furnished to the Clerk of the Assembly and was published in the Votes and Proceedings of the House of Assembly on the 13th April, 1955.

In consequence of the publication of the certificate of the Electoral Commission and in accordance with an amendment of the "Constitution Act 1934," His Excellency the Governor, by Proclamation published in the Gazette of the 6th April, 1955, declared that the provisions of Section 24A of the "Constitution Act 1934," shall apply to the House of Assembly chosen at the General Election of Members of the House held on the 19th February, 1955.

The provisions of this Section reduce the life of the present Parliament from five years to three years from the day of the return of the Writs unless it is sooner dissolved by the Governor. It also provides that the minority party may cause to be

nominated for Election as Speaker, one of the Members of the Assembly who is a Member of that Party and also provides for the election of Chairman of Committees from members of the minority party.

#### HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY.

The House of Assembly was dissolved by His Excellency the Governor on the 14th January, 1955, and the following dates were fixed in connection with the Election.

Issue of Writ .....	17th January, 1955.
Nominations closed .....	25th January, 1955.
Poll .....	19th February, 1955.

The Writs were returned on the 4th May, 1955, from which date the life of the Parliament commenced.

Nominations received for the several Divisions totalled 63 (Bass 13; Darwin 12; Denison 13; Franklin 13; Wilmot 12). Table 2 shows the number of Candidates nominated at previous Elections.

On this occasion in the draw for party group position on the Ballot Paper, the Labour Group in each Division drew Group "A", the first position and the names of the Candidates comprising this party group were placed first on the Ballot Paper.

In three Divisions an Independent Candidate was nominated.

The Election was conducted under the provisions of the "Electoral Act 1907," and amendments thereto. From reports received from Returning Officers no difficulty was experienced and the work of all Officers was carried out with efficiency and expedition. I desire to express my appreciation of the manner in which their duties were carried out and for the promptitude with which the final results were obtained.

There were 469 Polling Places throughout the State at which Electors were able to record their votes. Electors who were absent from their subdivisions recorded 12,913 Absent Votes, and 628 persons voted under Section 116A, claiming their names were removed from the roll owing to the error of an Officer. Of these persons, only 180 established a claim and their votes were admitted to the scrutiny.

A summary of Absent, Postal and Section 116A Voters is appended hereto under Table 11.

Some difficulty was experienced by Electors on this occasion owing to the variation in the hours of Polling. At Federal Elections, Polling Booths are open from 8 a.m. until 8 p.m., whilst on this occasion for the State Election, the hours of Polling were from 8.30 a.m. until 7 p.m.

A considerable number of Electors who failed to vote at this Election submitted the explanation that they were confused over the hours of Polling. Since the last State Election on the 6th May, 1950, there has been three Federal Elections and a Referendum, at all of which the hours of Polling were from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. It appears desirable to endeavour to obtain uniformity in the hours of Polling at State and Commonwealth Elections.

#### HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY DIVISIONS.

By a Commission under the hand of His Excellency the Governor General, Distribution Commissioners were appointed to report upon and where necessary redefine boundaries of the Electoral Divisions for the State.

The Commissioners have furnished their report and due notice of the suggested changes have been promulgated.

A summary of the report showing the proposed re-distribution and a general description of the suggested amendments is included herein (Under Appendix D.)

## OFFICIAL OBSERVERS AT ELECTION.

During the holding of the General Election, two American visitors were observers of the method of conducting elections under proportional representation, and the counting of the choices at the scrutiny of votes. They were Professor Lionel H. Laing, Professor of Political Science, University of Michigan, U.S.A., and Mr. George Howatt, a Fullbright Scholar from the University of Pennsylvania.

These gentlemen were afforded every facility in undertaking their observations and each expressed appreciation of the co-operation and assistance given them during their stay in Hobart.

It is pleasing to record my appreciation of the services of the State Electoral Staff who carried out their duties with credit to themselves and to the Department, I also desire to thank Divisional Returning Officers and Legislative Council Returning Officers for their assistance and co-operation in conducting Elections during the period under review.

I desire also to express the thanks of the Department to Mr. J. C. Stephen, the Deputy Commonwealth Statistician for the compilation of statistical tables appended to this report.

The census of 1954 showed the proportion of adults to be 600 per 1000 of the total population of Tasmania. The franchise was extended to certain classes of persons (minors) who had experienced war service which was mainly responsible for the increase in the number of voters per 1000 of population to 626 in 1946 and 609 in 1948. By 1950, however, the effect of this concession was no longer apparent due to the effluxion of time and movement in population.

The proportion of informal votes (3.79 per cent) was very much below that of the 1950 election, but did not differ materially from earlier elections. The divisions showed percentages ranging from 4.06 per cent in Bass to 3.22 per cent in Darwin.

The number of candidates totalled 63 which was 3 below the number standing at the election of 1950 and 23 below the record number in 1946.

The number of counts (235) was the lowest recorded for many years, while the greatest number of counts in a division (Denison) (81) was the highest recorded on this occasion but was considerably below the highest recorded at the previous election.

Although males comprise a majority of population, male electors were slightly in a minority (49.4 per cent), also, as voters, they were in a minority (49.9 per cent).

The preceding table, giving the percentage of electors who exercised the franchise at all general elections, both State and Federal, since 1916, indicates roughly the rise and fall of political interest among the electors up to 1928. Both its rise and fall are much more pronounced in the case of women than of men. The proportions for the subsequent elections are dominated by compulsory voting, first in the Federal sphere and later in the State. The absence of many electors from the State on military service would largely account for the lower percentage of voters at the elections in 1940 and 1941.

#### REPRESENTATION OF PARTIES.

At the election of the 19th February, 1955, 63 candidates were nominated. Of these, 30 were endorsed nominees of the Labour Party, 30 were nominated by the Liberal Party, and 3 described themselves as Independent.

The result was the return of 15 Labour, 15 Liberal.

The No. 1 votes were cast directly for the three groups in each of the five electoral divisions of the State as follows:—

The method of election is briefly the "single transferable vote" system, and the law provides that a seat shall be allotted to each complete quota of votes in each division.

The quota in each division is ascertained by the following formula:—

$$\frac{\text{Number of valid ballot-papers}}{\text{Number to be elected} + 1} + 1 = \text{Quota.}$$

Any remainder is ignored.

For the election of a "House" of 30 members, there will therefore be 35 theoretical quotas, which, however, because of "exhaust" votes, will not become complete.

The following table shows for each division, and for the State as a whole, the number of first preference votes, the number of quotas, and the seats won by each party:—

From the above table it will be seen that there were 3.42 quotas of Labour votes made up of unrepresented fractions of 15 members elected, Liberal votes were under-represented by .83 quotas for 15 members elected, while Independent candidates polled 0.175 quotas of unrepresented votes.

The following table shows the party strength as indicated by the quotas of No. 1 preferences, and the seats actually won by Labour and Non-Labour groups at each general election since 1941. Independent votes have been distributed as described elsewhere in the context, and the total for the State is the aggregate of the results for the five divisions.

A brief summary of the results of the 1955 election for each division is appended:—

#### BASS.

There were 12 candidates in this division, of whom six were Labour, six Liberal, and one Independent. Valid votes numbered 30,598, of which 16,364 were recorded for Labour, 14,074 for Liberal, and 160 for the Independent Candidate. Labour Candidates secured 3.74 quotas and gained three seats, and Liberals gained three seats for 3.22 quotas. In all, 33 counts were necessary for the complete election. There was little cross-voting.

First preferences failed to secure the election of any candidate. On the 5th, 12th, and 33rd count, three Labour candidates were elected, and on the 20th, 22nd and 25th counts three Liberal candidates secured election. Three candidates forfeited their deposit, one Labour, one Liberal, and one Independent.

#### DARWIN.

Twelve candidates—six Labour; and six Liberal candidates nominated for Darwin. Labour polled 16,470 votes, 3.73 quotas for three seats; Liberals, 14,412 votes, 3.27 quotas for three seats.

First preferences secured the election of one Labour candidate, the second Labour candidate was elected on the 25th count, whilst the third Labour candidate was elected on the 35th count. On the 8th count, one Liberal candidate was elected and on the 13th count, two other Liberal candidates were elected.

#### DENISON.

The Denison Division attracted thirteen candidates, of whom six were Liberal, six Labour, and one Independent. Labour polled 12,914 votes for 3.55 quotas and three seats; Liberal 10,811 votes, 2.98 quotas for three seats; and Independents, 1699 votes, 0.47 quotas for no seat. One Labour and one Liberal candidate were elected at the first count, but 81 counts were needed before the last candidate was elected.

Little cross-voting was evident in this division. Two candidates—one Liberal and one Labour—forfeited their deposits.

FRANKLIN.

Thirteen candidates contested the election for Franklin. Six were Liberal; six Labour; and one Independent. Labour candidates polled 18,491 votes, 3.50 quotas for three seats; Liberals 17,232 votes, 3.26 quotas for three seats; Independents 1299 votes for no seat. Little cross-voting took place in this division. One Liberal and one Labour candidate forfeited their deposits.

WILMOT.

For this division there were six Liberal and six Labour candidates. Of the 32,553 valid votes, 18,123, 3.90 quotas went to Labour for three seats and 14,430, 3.10 quotas to Liberal for three seats. One candidate was elected on the first preferences and only 31 counts were required to complete the election.

ABSENT VOTES, POSTAL VOTES, AND SECTION 116A.

Under the provisions of Section 116A, 628 persons whose names were not on the roll claimed the right to vote, and filled in ballot-papers. Of these 448 were rejected because their claim to be on the roll could not be sustained. The remaining 180 were admitted to the scrutiny and 9 of them rejected for informalities, leaving 171 valid votes under Section 116A.

The number of absent votes was 12,913, but these included a number whose names were not, in fact, on the roll, and 1255 were rejected on this account. A further 517 were rejected for informalities, leaving 11,141 valid absent votes.

Taking together the claims under Section 116A and attempts to vote under provisions for electors absent from their usual subdivisions, the number of votes disallowed were:—1955, 1255; 1950, 1749; 1948, 1650; 1946, 1448; 1941, 2283; 1937, 1897; 1934, 1687; 1931, 2086. These disallowed votes are not counted either as votes recorded or as informal votes.
