REPORT ON PARLIAMENTARY ELECTIONS

THE HONOURABLE THE CHIEF SECRETARY.

I HAVE the honour to submit the following report upon elections conducted during the period 1959-1964.

THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

Appendix "A" of this report shows enrolment figures for all Legislative Council Divisions as at 31st August, 1964.

The total enrolment shown in the preceding report was 125,208 as at the same day of 1959. Since that later date the total has increased by 27,765 to 152,973, which is equivalent to 79.29% of electors enrolled for the House of Assembly elections (192,909).

During the period under review 83,669 additions were made to the rolls; there were 55,904 deletions and 19,267 alterations—a total of 158,840 notations to obtain a nett increase in enrolment of 27,765.

Legislative Council rolls are now compiled on a continuous check basis and with such a constant review of enrolment it is practicable to present a "clean" roll for election purposes at short notice. The former necessity to conduct habitation and field reviews has now been obviated.

It is interesting to note that for the first time in an Electoral report, female electors for the Legislative Council exceed the number of male electors enrolled. This excess was reached in June, 1960, and has increased to a preponderance of 3,057 as at 31st August, 1964.

THE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY

The Assembly was dissolved by a proclamation issued under the hand of His Excellency the Governor on 2nd April, 1964.

The following dates were fixed for the purposes of the General Election—

Issue of Writs—7th April, 1964.

Nominations—15th April, 1964.

Poll—2nd May, 1964.

Return of Writs—On or before 14th May, 1964.

The Writs were returned on 13th May, 1964, from which date the life of Parliament commenced.

Nominations for this election totalled 117 (Bass 25, Braddon 26, Dension 22, Franklin 23, Wilmot 21). This number easily constitutes a record, the number of candidates offering in 1959 being 89. The increase in candidature was clearly reflected in the number of forfeited deposits. To retain his deposit a candidate must obtain votes at least equivalent to one-fifth part of the quota at the time of his exclusion from the count. Upon the present occasion no less than 47 candidates lost their deposits. This apparent excess of candidates offering produced a considerable increase in almost all phases of election procedure and, at the same time, provided no commensurate benefit to the State. The statutory nomination deposit of £15 was prescribed in the early 1920's and it is considered that a more realistic figure today would be £50.

The draw for party group position on the ballot paper resulted in the Liberal Group being placed first in two Divisions, Independent Groups first in two Divisions and the D.L.P. Group first in the remaining Division.

The Country Party contested the 1964 General Election in four Divisions for the first time since 1922.

At this Election, information of first choice support accorded to candidates in each of the five Divisions was made available to the public per medium of television on polling night. Although this was the first time such an operation had been undertaken, the whole proceeding was effected in a satisfactory manner.

The electors were provided with 481 polling booths at which 184,571 ordinary votes, 10,216 absent votes and 996 votes under Section 116a were recorded.

Although there are many associates to whom it is thought fitting that appreciation could well be expressed for the assistance given in the attainment of both election and electoral objectives during my term of office, this opportunity is readily taken to place on permanent record an acknowledgment of the invaluable services rendered by the Assistant Chief Electoral Officer (Mr. S. G. Denehey). Other members of the State Electoral Department and Returning Officers of the Council and of the Assembly performed their duties in an efficient and creditable manner. I am also indebted to the Deputy Statistician (Mr. R. Lakin) for his assistance in the compilation of Tables 1 to 15 included in this report.

The census of 1954 showed the proportion of adults to be 600 per 1000 of the total population of Tasmania. The franchise was extended to certain classes of persons (minors) who had experienced war service, which was mainly responsible for the increase in the number of voters per 1000 of population to 626 in 1946 and 609 in 1948. By 1950, however, the effect of this concession was no longer apparent due to the effluxion of time and movement in population.

The proportion of informal votes (4.32 per cent) represents a drop of 1.44 per cent on 1959. The divisions showed percentages ranging from 3.40 in Braddon to 4.98 in Bass.

The number of candidates totalled 117, which was the highest number on record.

The number of counts (1,249) was the highest ever recorded and the greatest number of counts in a division (Denison, 308) also constituted a record.

The preceding table, giving the percentage of electors who exercised the franchise at all general elections, both State and Federal, since 1916, indicates roughly the rise and fall of political interest among the electors up to 1928. Both its rise and fall are much more pronounced in the case of women than of men. The proportions for the subsequent elections are dominated by compulsory voting, first in the Federal sphere and later in the State. The absence of many electors from the State on military service would largely account for the lower percentage of voters at the elections in 1940 and 1941.

REPRESENTATION OF PARTIES

At the election of the 2nd May, 1964, 117 candidates were nominated. Of these, 39 were endorsed nominees of the Labour Party, 37 were nominated by the Liberal Party, 20 were nominated by the Country Party, 9 were nominated by the Democratic Labour Party, 1 was nominated by the Communist Party and 11 nominated as Independents.

The result was the return of 19 Labour and 16 Liberal.

The No. 1 votes were cast directly for the seven groups in each of the five electoral divisions of the State as follows—

The method of election is briefly the "single transferable vote" system, and the law provides that a seat be allotted to each complete quota of votes in each division.

The quota in each division is ascertained by the following formula:—

$$\frac{\text{Number of valid ballot-papers}}{\text{Number to be elected} + 1} + 1 = \text{Quota.}$$

Any remainder is ignored.

The following table shows for each division, and for the State as a whole, the number of first preference votes, the number of quotas, and the seats won by each party:—

From the above table it will be seen that there were 1.58 quotas of Labour votes made up of unrepresented fractions of 19 members elected, Liberal votes were over-represented by 0.55 quotas for 16 members elected, while other candidates were under represented by 3.97 quotas with no members elected.

The following Table 7 shows the party strength as indicated by the quotas of No. 1 preferences, and the seats actually won by Labour, Liberal and other groups at each general election since 1956, and the total for the State is the aggregate of the results for the five divisions.

A brief summary of the results of the 1964 election for each division is appended:—

BASS

There were 25 candidates in this Division, of whom eight were Labour, eight Liberal, four Country Party, two Democratic Labour and three Independents. Valid votes numbered 35,060 of which 17,487 were recorded for Labour, 14,459 for Liberal, 1,894 for Country Party, 684 for Democratic Labour and 536 for Independents. Labour candidates secured 3.99 quotas and gained four seats; Liberals 3.30 quotas for three seats and the remaining candidates obtained 3,114 votes representing 0.71 of a quota.

A Liberal candidate was elected at count 26, a Labour candidate at count 36 and two more Labour candidates at count 83. Two Liberal candidates were elected at count 183 and the seventh vacancy was filled by a Labour candidate at count 234. Nine deposits were forfeited in this Division—two Liberal, two Country Party, two Democratic Labour and three Independents.

BRADDON

Twenty six candidates—eight Labour, nine Liberal, six Country Party and three Democratic Labour nominated for Braddon. Labour polled 20,032 votes, 4.52 quotas for four seats; Liberal 11,688 votes, 2.64 quotas for three seats; Country Party 2,921 votes and Democratic Labour 797 votes; the total valid votes being 35,418.

First preference votes secured the election of one Labour candidate. A Labour candidate was elected at each of the counts 57, 82 and 217. Three Liberal candidates were elected at count 278. In this Division half the candidates offering forfeited their deposits. These were:—one Labour, five Liberal, four Country Party and three Democratic Labour.

DENISON

This Division was contested by twenty-two candidates—eight Labour, seven Liberal, one Democratic Labour, one Communist, and five Independents. Of the 33,206 valid votes, Labour polled 14,623 votes, 3.53 quotas for three seats; Liberal polled 14,910 votes, 3.59 quotas for four seats; Independents 2,495 votes, the Democratic Labour candidate 1,086 and the Communist candidate 92 votes.

One Liberal and one Labour candidate were elected on first preferences, and the remaining candidates in the following order:—a Liberal candidate at count 75; a Labour candidate at count 99; another Liberal candidate on the 131st count; and a Liberal and Labour candidate on count 308.

Eight candidates—one Labour, two Liberal, one Communist and four Independents forfeited their deposits.

FRANKLIN

Twenty-three candidates contested the election for Franklin. Eight of these were Labour, seven Liberal, five Country Party, one Democratic Labour and two Independent. The total valid vote was 39,823 and of this number Labour candidates polled 21,190 votes, 4.26 quotas for four seats; Liberals 14,526 votes, 2.92 quotas for three seats; Country Party 1,854 votes, Democratic Labour 1,059 and Independents 1,194 votes.

Two Labour candidates were elected on first preferences; another Labour candidate at count 107; the first Liberal at count 133; a Labour candidate at count 226 and the remaining two Liberals at count 296.

Deposits were forfeited by seven candidates—one Labour, one Liberal, four Country Party and one Independent.

WILMOT

Wilmot was contested by twenty-one candidates—seven Labour, six Liberal, five Country Party, two Democratic Labour and one Independent. Labour polled 17,299 of the total of 33,084 valid votes for 4.28 quotas and four seats; Liberals totalled 12,408 votes, 3.00 quotas for three seats; the Country Party 2,611 votes; Democratic Labour 615 and the one Independent 151 votes.

One Labour and one Liberal were elected on primary votes; another Labour candidate at count 2; Liberals at the 101st and 103rd counts and two Labour candidate at count 133.

There were ten deposits forfeited by candidates—two Labour, two Liberal, three Country Party, two Democratic Labour and one Independent.

ABSENT VOTES, POSTAL VOTES, AND SECTION 116A

Under the provisions of Section 116A, 996 persons whose names were not on the roll claimed the right to vote, and filled in ballot-papers. Of these 882 were rejected because their claim to be on the roll could not be sustained. The remaining 114 were admitted to the scrutiny and six of them rejected for informalities, leaving 108 valid votes under Section 116A.

The number of absent votes was 10,216, but these included some whose names were not, in fact, on the roll, and 1,655 were rejected on this account. A further 448 were rejected for informalities, leaving 8,113 valid absent votes.

Taking together the claims under Section 116A and attempts to vote under provisions for electors absent from their usual subdivisions, the number of votes disallowed were:—1964, 2,537; 1959, 2,515; 1956, 1,941; 1955, 1,703; 1950, 1,749; 1948, 1,650; 1946, 1,448; 1941, 2,283; 1937, 1,897; 1934, 1,687; 1931, 2,086. These disallowed votes are not counted either as votes recorded or as informal votes.
