# Commissioner's introduction

In 2018, the eleventh round of elections were held under the *Local Government Act 1993*. The Act provides that the Tasmanian Electoral Commission (TEC) and the Electoral Commissioner are responsible for the supervision of elections.

## Legislative Change

On Wednesday 22 November 2017, two amendment Acts affecting local government elections received Royal Assent:

- The *Glenorchy City Council (Dismissal of Councillors) Act 2017* which dismissed the councillors of the Glenorchy City Council and made provision in relation to the election to be held subsequent to that dismissal.
- *Local Government Amendment (Targeted Review) Act 2017* which, among other things, provided for an extension to the election timeframes to allow for changes to Australia Post's delivery schedule.

Amendments to the *Local Government (General) Regulations 2015*, came into effect on 8 August 2018. The election related changes to the Regulations were:

- Removal of limits on the size and number of posters/signs and on radio and television time and newspaper space.
- New expenditure limits (including all advertising costs):
  - \$16,000 for all candidates contesting a Clarence City, Glenorchy City, Hobart City, Launceston City or Kingborough elections.
  - \$10,000 for all candidates contesting an election for any other Tasmanian local government council.

Every candidate must now declare the costs incurred for all electoral advertising used during the relevant period, including costs incurred prior to 9 August for electoral advertising used on or after 9 August 2018.

## Early Glenorchy City Council elections

The Glenorchy City Council elections were held from November 2017 to January 2018. Twenty-four candidates nominated for councillor positions, two who also nominated for mayor and six who also nominated for deputy mayor.

Glenorchy City Council elections saw participation increase from 47.76% to 54.79% and the number of nominations increase from 28 to 32 between the 2014 and 2018 elections – this against the 2018 election being conducted over the summer as a stand-alone election.

As Glenorchy City was a separate election, throughout this report, Glenorchy statistics have largely been reported in a separate table, or at the bottom of the state-wide data.

## **Postal voting**

Under the *Local Government Act 1993*, council elections are conducted by universal postal voting. After the announcement of candidates, a postal ballot pack is automatically sent to every elector on the election roll (delivered 8-12 October). The 3-envelope postal vote system ensures the secrecy and security of the ballot. This system involves:

- an outer window face envelope,
- a reply paid envelope and
- a ballot paper security envelope with an extended perforated flap for voter details and signature (*required to verify that only eligible electors vote*).

In addition to the above envelopes, the postal ballot pack includes ballot papers, and an information booklet. Listed in alphabetical order, the information booklet contains passport-style photographs of candidates and a candidate statement. Candidates contesting more than one position are restricted to a single statement.

## **Casual vacancies**

Thirty casual vacancies occurred between the 2014 and 2018 ordinary elections. Twenty-three vacancies were filled by recount and five through by-elections. Two vacancies were not filled due to the vacancy occurring within 6 months prior to the 2018 elections. A summary of recounts and by-elections appears on page 30 of this report.

## **Elector polls**

A council may hold an elector poll on any issue it determines. It may also be required to hold an elector poll following a process requiring petitions signed by at least 5% or 1,000 of the electors in the municipal area. A council is not bound by the result of an elector poll.

No elector polls were conducted between the 2014 and 2018 elections.

## **Counting systems used at local government elections**

All councillor elections are conducted using a slightly modified version of the Hare-Clark system used for Tasmanian House of Assembly elections.

Mayors and deputy mayors of all councils are popularly elected in conjunction with councillor elections. These elections are conducted using a preferential electoral system similar to that used for Tasmanian Legislative Council and Commonwealth House of Representatives elections.

The Robson rotation system is used to rotate the order in which candidate names appear on ballot papers for councillor, mayoral and deputy mayoral elections.

Voting in Tasmanian local government elections is not compulsory.

# Conduct of 2018 State-wide elections

In 2018, the TEC was commissioned to conduct the full elections for 28 councils.

At the close of rolls, 356,810 electors were enrolled in the 28 councils. These comprised 348,756 (97.74%) from the State roll and 8 054 (2.26%) from general managers' rolls. Council enrolment statistics are shown on page 13 of this report.

At the close of nominations:

- 481 candidates nominated for 253 councillor positions,
- 102 candidates nominated for 28 mayoral positions and
- 135 candidates nominated for 28 deputy mayoral positions.

Voting was not required for mayors of Central Highlands, Kentish, Sorell and Tasman, as only one candidate was nominated for each of these vacancies. Nor was a poll required for Sorell councillors as nine candidates nominated for the nine positions.

## High levels of engagement in 2018

The 2018 elections had increased engagement, with higher numbers of nominations for many councils and the second highest ever participation rate since universal postal voting was introduced in 1993. The increase in participation was higher with younger electors.

Hobart City Council elections saw participation increase from 51.70% to 61.94% and the number of nominations increase from 46 to 58 between the 2014 and 2018 elections.

## **Public awareness and election communication**

The 2014 advertising campaign featuring the slogan “Make your Mark, Vote Local” was again used and utilised television, radio, newspapers and digital media to create awareness of the elections and encourage participation.

The awareness campaign extended further into Facebook and also included distinctive artwork on the outer envelopes as a way of encouraging voters to open the envelope. Regular media releases gave progressive updates on the number of ballot papers returned for all councils and the Commissioner made himself available for media interviews.

The availability of the free call service and the website were promoted extensively in our advertising campaign, and appeared in the information booklet sent to each elector with ballot papers.

Expanding on the previous success of our hands-on postal ballot education kits, the TEC worked with Australia Post to commission miniature Australia Post boxes to add another layer of authenticity to our kits. More than 100 kits were ordered by 46 Tasmanian schools, giving teachers the capacity to engage over 3,000 students across primary, secondary and college year in a hands-on, relevant election experience.

Election tally-rooms were set up in Hobart, Launceston and Devonport, operating from 6pm until 11pm on Tuesday 30 October. The media, candidates and the general public were all invited to attend.

## **Data entry of 23 councillor ballots**

Data entry of 23 councillor ballots was undertaken across Launceston and Hobart locations, using the data entry system 'Computer Count' (increased from 10 ballots in 2014). The remaining four councillor ballots (Circular Head, Waratah-Wynyard, Burnie City and Central Coast) were conducted by hand and managed using the TEC's 'HC Auto' computer system.

The majority of election counts were completed by Thursday 1 November, with the more complex counts being completed on Saturday 3 November. The time required for each count varied according to the numbers of positions vacant and candidates contesting the election.

A further benefit of data entry of councillor ballot papers is significantly smaller costs for filling councillor vacancies, as hand counting is no longer required for conducting recounts.

## **Informal voting**

Informal voting increased at the 2018 elections. The main area of increase appears to stem from an increased number of ballot papers containing a repetition of an early preference. Not unexpectedly, those councils with larger numbers to be elected (higher formality requirements) and large fields of candidates had the highest levels of informality:

- Hobart City 8.78% – 12 preferences required from a field of 36
- Launceston City 7.97% – 12 preferences required from a field of 32
- Clarence City 7.28% – 12 preferences required from a field of 25

Parliament and the local government community may wish to consider reducing the required sequence of preferences (perhaps 1 to 5, similar to the House of Assembly).

## **Cost of elections**

State-wide, the average cost per elector has increased from \$5.59 to \$6.92, an increase of 24% over the first all-in-all-out elections in 2014.

Factors that have contributed to this rise include a Hobart consumer price index (CPI) increase of 5.42%, a 4.29% growth in the electoral roll together with a significant increase in voter turnout, the large increase in cost of Australia Post services (around \$200,000 more than in 2014), the increase in number of candidates, the inclusion of a more complicated Advertising Expenditure Return process to be completed by all 481 candidates and the absence of the Glenorchy City Council elections.

## Structure of this report

This report is divided into the following sections:

**State-wide election statistics** – this section provides statistics for all councils at the various stages of the postal voting system, including an informal ballot paper survey (includes Glenorchy City elections statistics even though these elections occurred earlier in the year).

**Elected councillors, mayors and deputy mayors** – this section lists all mayors, deputy mayors and councillors elected at the ordinary elections and the Glenorchy City election.

**Casual vacancies** – this section includes a summary of all recounts and by-elections between the 2014 and 2018 ordinary elections.

**Example postal ballot pack** – this section includes examples of ballot and advertising material used.

**Samples of election awareness campaign materials** – this section includes copies of all press advertisements used in the 'Make your Mark – Vote local' election advertising campaign.

**Glenorchy City Council Election** – Sample ballot pack and election awareness materials for the Glenorchy City Council election.

**State-wide map of local government areas**

Separate election booklets have been produced for each council which includes first preference votes, the distribution of preferences and a list of all candidates contesting each ballot. Each booklet also contains details of all council by-elections and recounts held between the 2014 and 2018 ordinary elections.

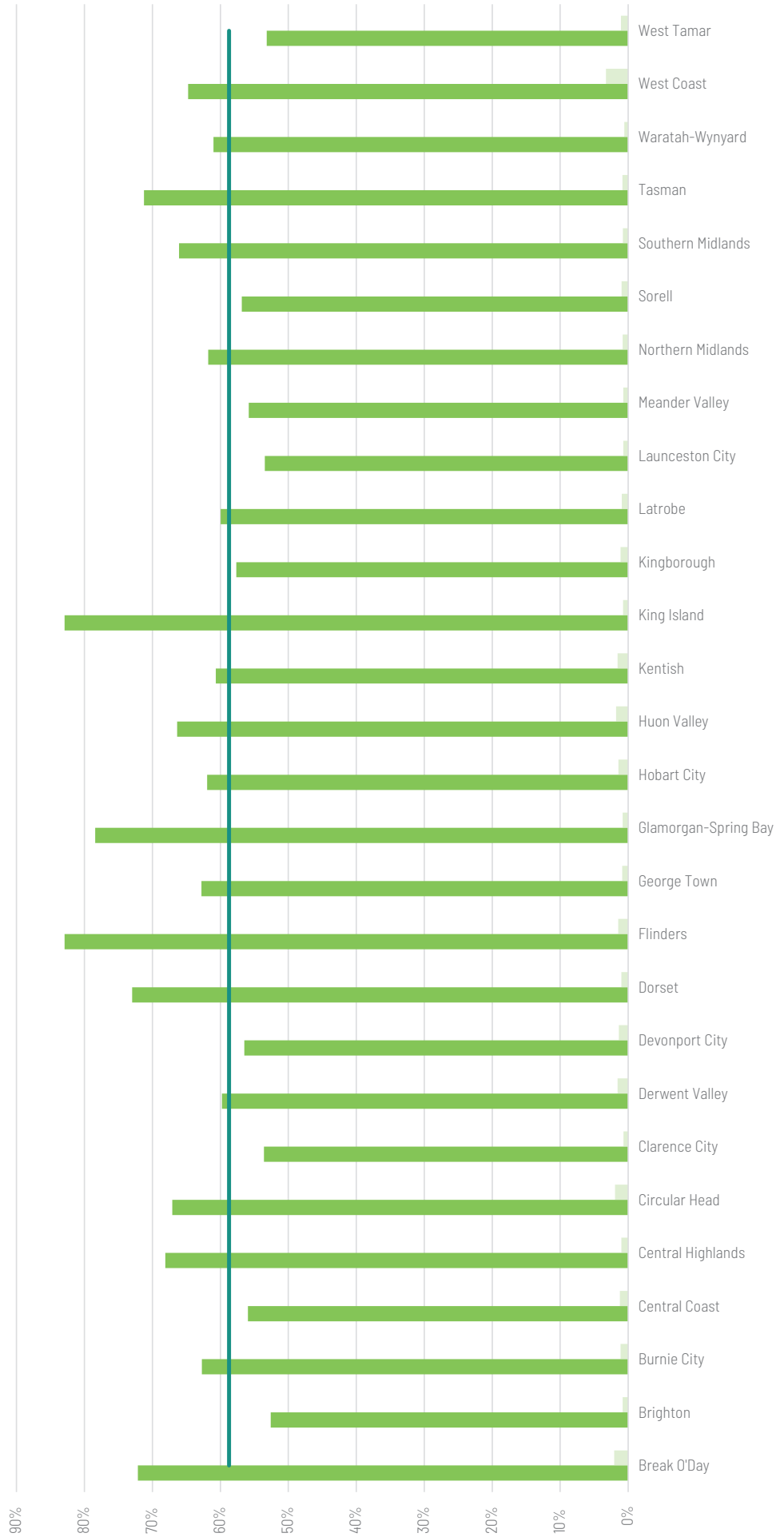
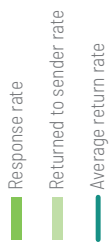

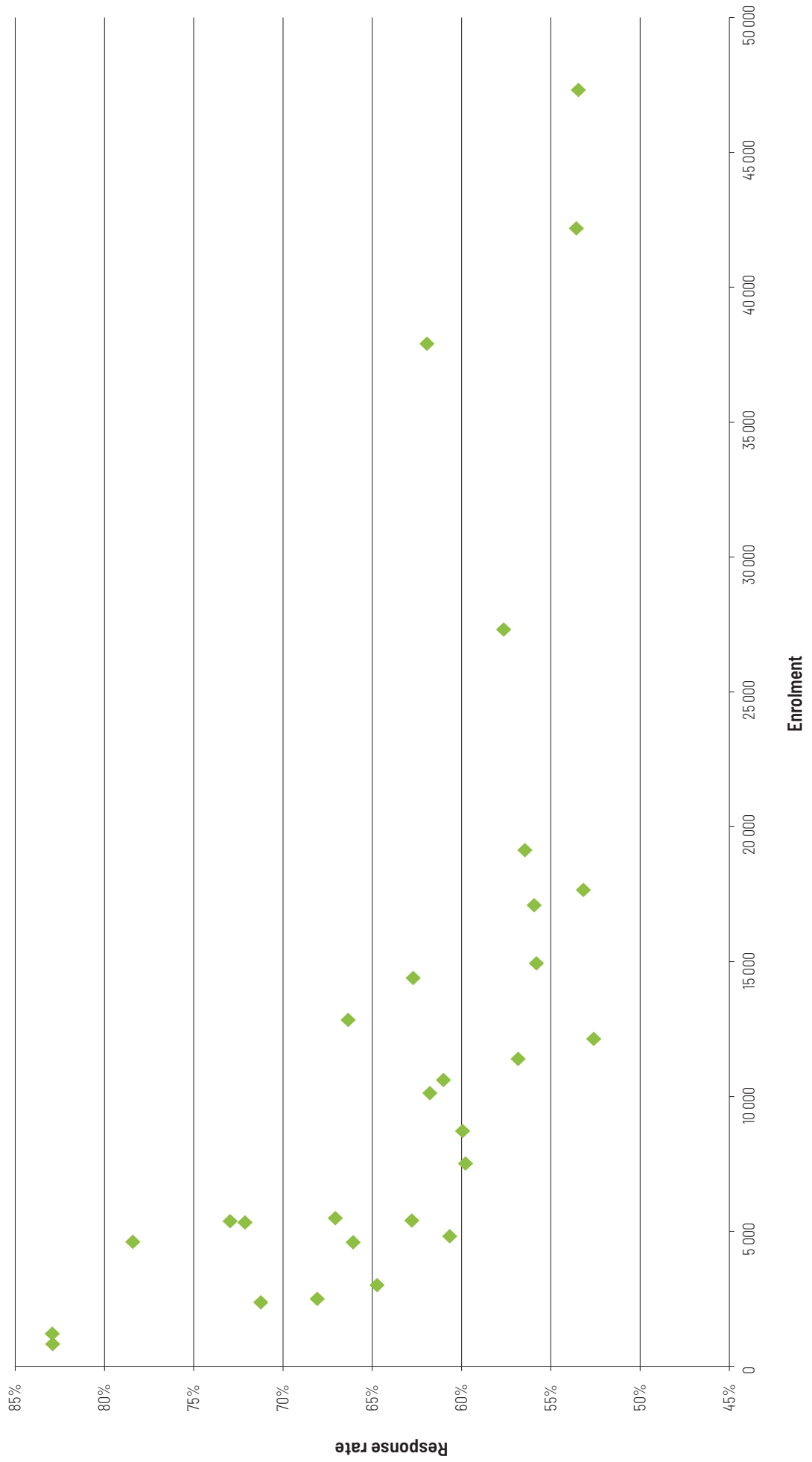

# State-wide response rate by age group and gender

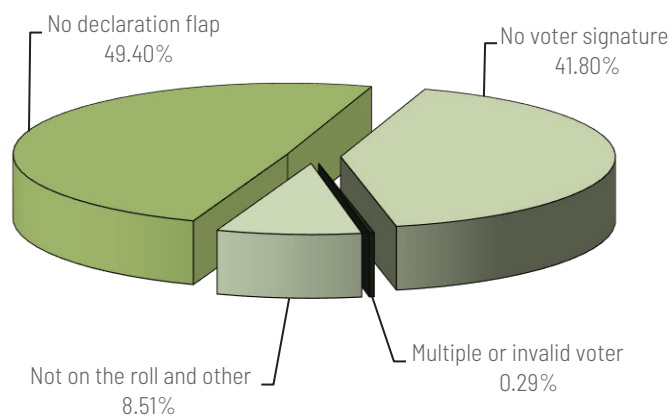

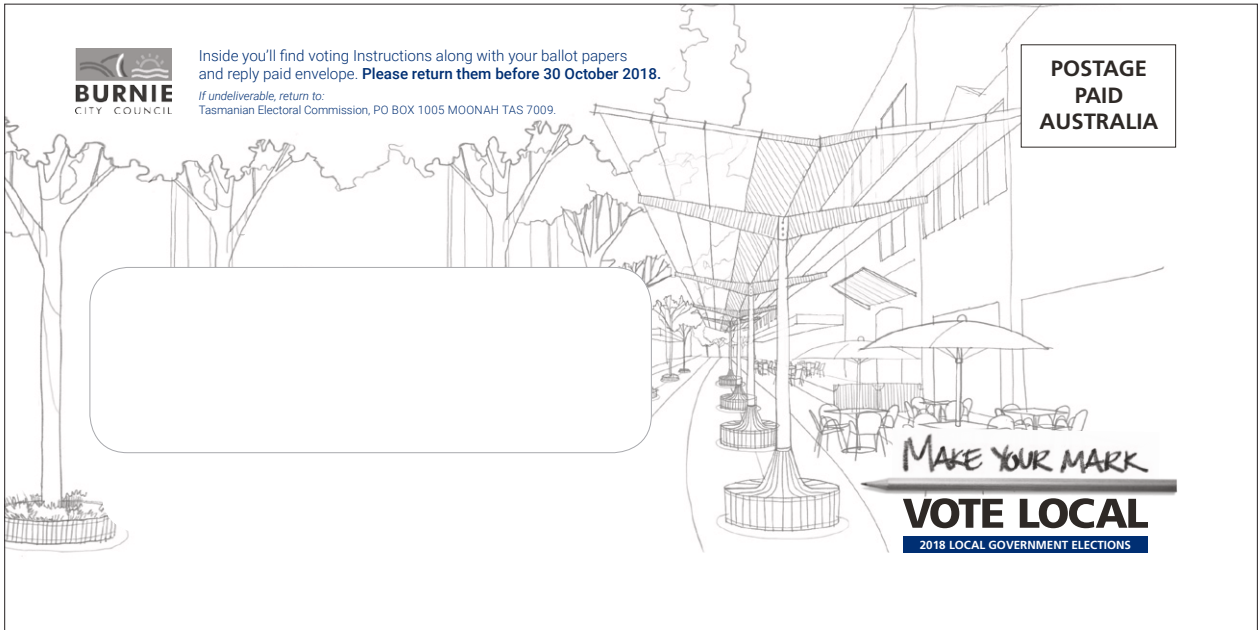

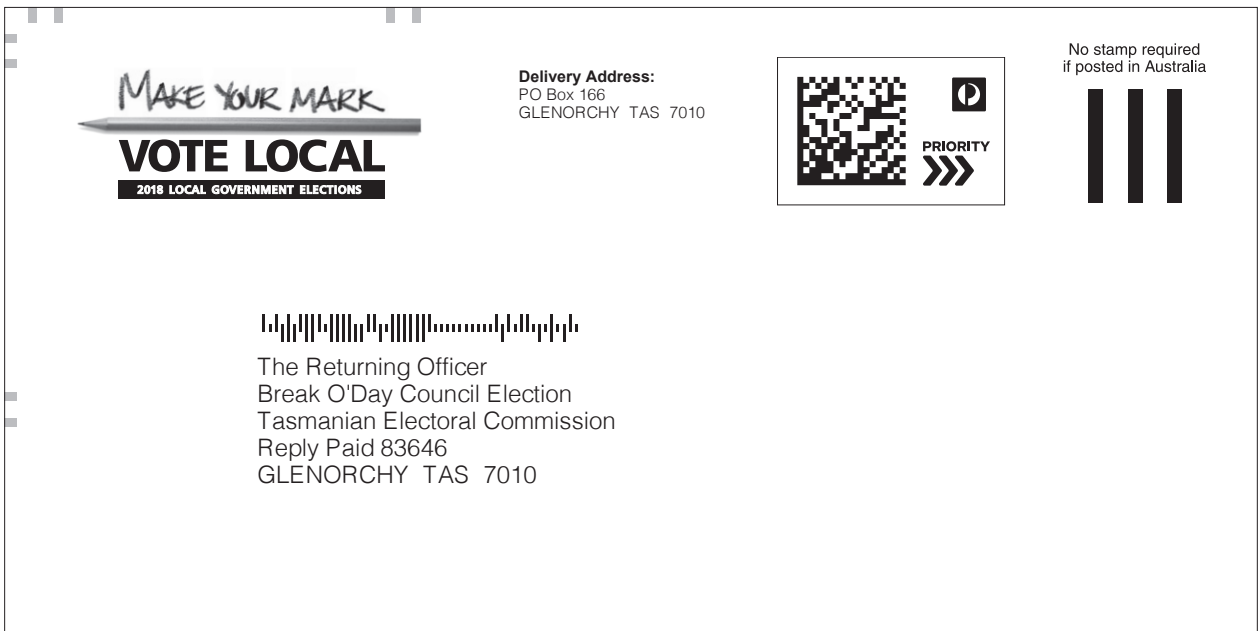

# Glenorchy City Council

## Nominations

Nominations are invited and must be lodged, posted or faxed so as to be received by the returning officer before noon on Monday 11 December 2017. Nominations may also be received by Simon Scott at the Glenorchy City Council office.

Nomination forms together with "Information for Candidates" booklets are available from the Tasmanian Electoral Commission website and the Council office. Candidates may provide a statement of up to 600 characters of biographical and other information to accompany the ballot papers sent to electors. Candidates may also provide a passport style photograph to be printed alongside their statement. Candidates who wish to provide a candidate statement and/or photograph are required to submit them online.

## Enrolment

If you are currently on the State electoral roll for an address in the Glenorchy City Council municipal area, or on the Council General Manager's roll, you are enrolled for these elections.

If your enrolment is not up-to-date, you can update your details via the TEC website, or by completing an enrolment form (available at any post office or electoral office). Hurry, as the roll closes at 6pm next Thursday.

You may apply to enrol on the General Manager's roll if you own or occupy land in the municipal area (but you are not eligible to be on the State roll for the area) or you are the nominated representative of a corporate body which owns or occupies land in the municipal area.

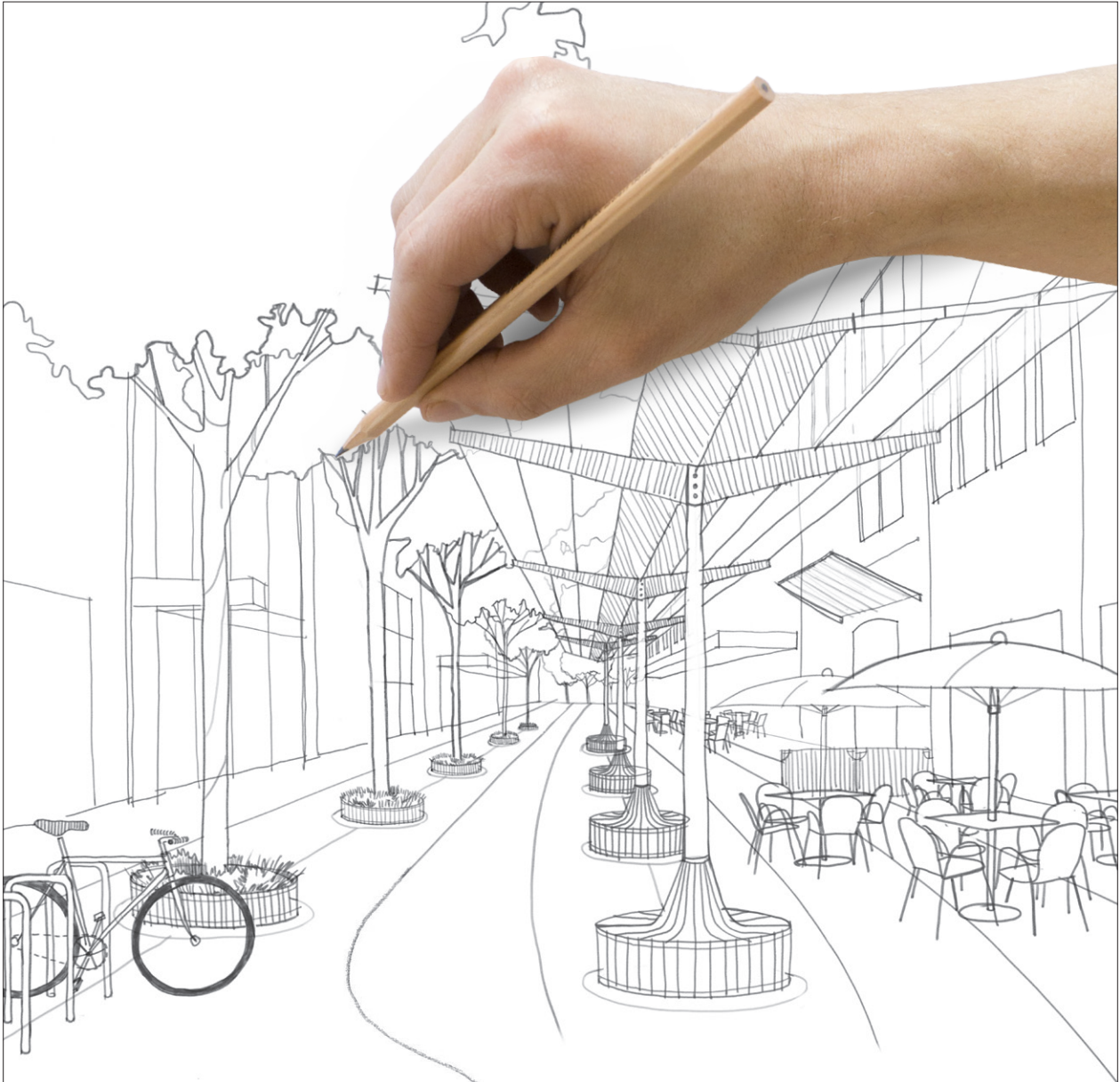

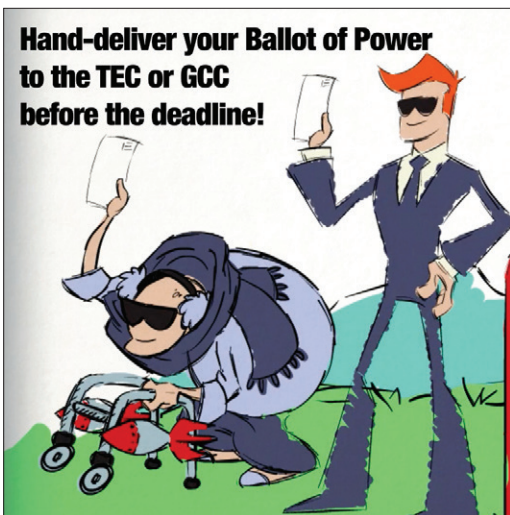

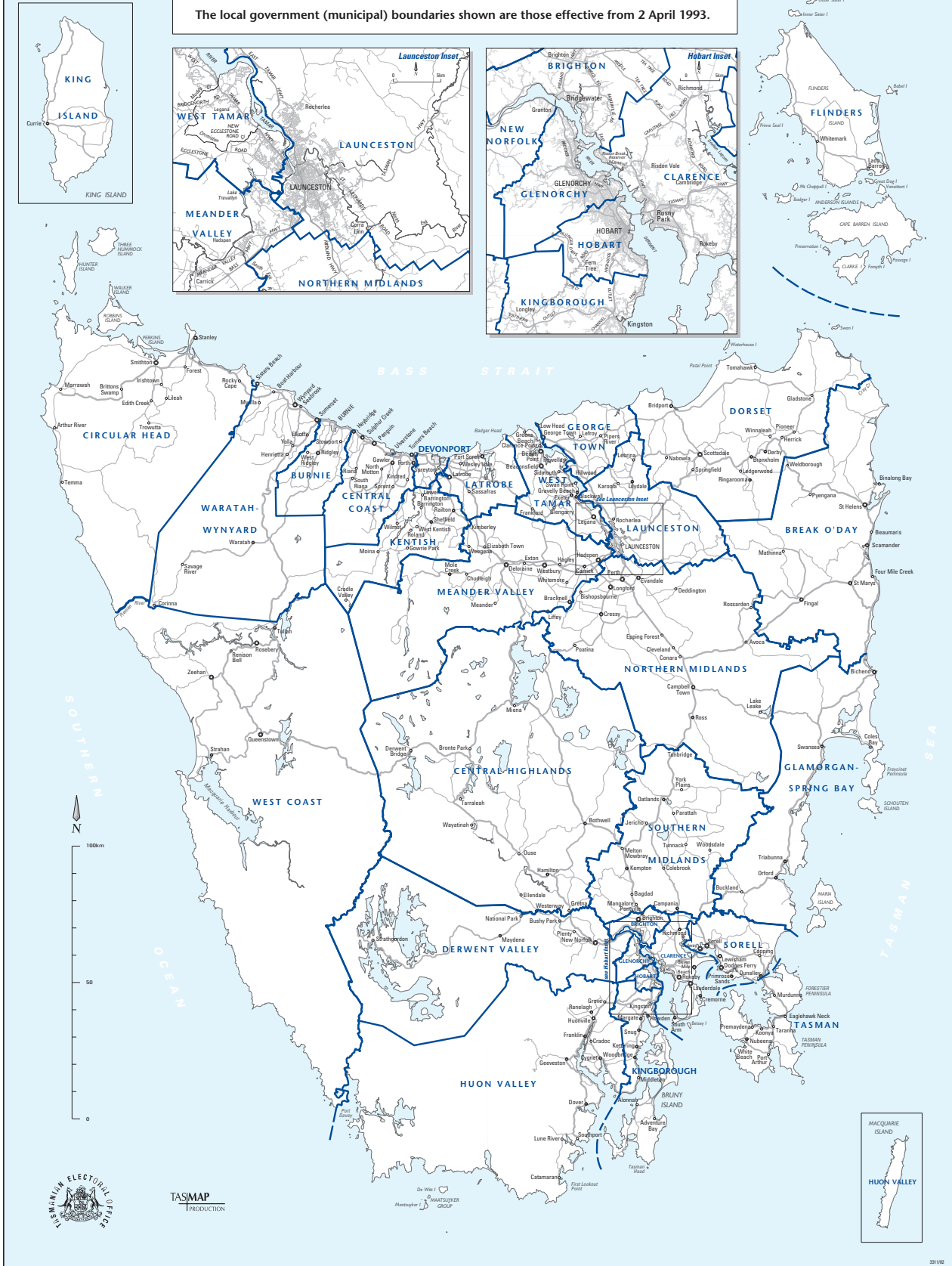


State-wide
