Local Government Elections in Tasmania

Every two years elections are held in all 29 councils for the positions of mayor and deputy mayor and half the councillor positions. Where required, by-elections are held concurrently for vacancies that have occurred since the last elections.

The Tasmanian Electoral Commission (TEC) supervises the conduct of elections in accordance with the *Local Government Act* 1993. Elections by postal ballot have been held in 1994, 1996, 1999 (deferred from 1998), 2000, 2002, 2005 (deferred from 2004) with the next elections due in October 2007.

Since 2000 mayors and deputy mayors are elected directly by the electors in all municipal areas. Previously, in most councils, mayors and deputy mayors were elected by the councillors at the first meeting of a new council.

Casual vacancies

Casual vacancies are filled by recount where possible, unless the vacancy occurs within 6 months of a forthcoming election. Only unelected candidates from the relevant election may contest a recount. A candidate elected at a recount serves until the next council election. If a recount is not possible, a by-election is held—with the candidate elected to serve for the remainder of the term of office of the original councillor.

Elector polls

A council may hold an elector poll on any issue it determines. It may also be required to hold an elector poll following petitions from electors in accordance with Part 6 of the Act. A council is not bound by the result of an elector poll.

Electoral system

Voting in Tasmanian local government elections is not compulsory.

Elections for councillor positions are conducted using a system modelled on the Hare-Clark method of proportional representation used in Tasmanian House of Assembly elections.

Mayoral and deputy mayoral elections use a preferential system similar to that used for Tasmanian Legislative Council and Federal House of Representatives elections.

Report on the 2005 Brighton Council Election

Elections were held for the positions of Mayor and Deputy Mayor for 2 year terms, and 5 Councillors for 4 year terms.

For the 2005 Local Government elections, 8722 Brighton electors were enrolled, comprising 8685 (99.58%) from the State House of Assembly roll and 37 (0.42%) from the General Manager's roll.

The percentage of Brighton electors returning their ballot papers was 48.35%, in comparison with 58.52% statewide.

Recounts

Two recounts were held between the 2002 and 2005 elections. Councillor Matt DePaoli resigned from the Brighton Council on Tuesday 1 July 2003. Two unelected candidates from the 2000 Brighton Council election contested the recount. The recount took place at noon Monday 14 July 2003. The other recount took place on Friday 9 January 2004 following the death of Councillor Cris Fitzpatrick on Thursday 1 January 2004. One unelected candidate from the 2000 Brighton Council election contested the recount and was therefore elected unopposed. Full details are provided on the back page.




